

LIBRARY BOARD MEETING  
FLIN FLON PUBLIC LIBRARY

7th JULY 1995

1. Call meeting to order 12:15 p.m.

2. New Business

The Community Technology Action Committee: Kent Lewarne, John Chipman, Graham Wood and Ken Shoemaker met with the Library Board of Directors to discuss the Community Free Net.

A discussion followed up from the presentation and proposal put forward by Michael Gillespie, on behalf of Blue Sky Freenet (a community network operated by volunteers from across Manitoba) on Wednesday June 28th, held in the Rotary Room.

The details of what I proposed are:

1. Rent a "terminal server port" in Cranberry Portage from MBnet for \$100/year;
2. Rent a telephone line at Cranberry Portage from MTS for approx \$25/month;
3. Purchase (or borrow) a 14,400-baud modem (~\$150) to be located at Cranberry Portage, connected between items #1 and #2 above. Jack can do the hookup.

That's it.

Once that is done, you can dial into that telephone number (with no toll charge) and access Blue Sky. This can be done by anyone from anywhere. If you do not publicize the telephone number, the library system could be the sole access point in your community. However, it makes sense to allow others to dial into the number when the library is closed.

We will create a menu and home page system for your area on the "core" computer system at Winnipeg. We will give any users you select the ability to modify, create, delete information on "your" community network. There is no cost for this. We will administrate the user IDs and passwords for you for the time being.

People dialing into that phone number will be greeted by a "Welcome to the Flin Flon Community Network" message. People from around the world will also have access to your home page, so it becomes a "Window on Flin Flon".

One single telephone line will allow people in your area to get acquainted with the idea of the community network, but it will become frustrating for users to get busy signals when that one line is in use. To allow more people to access the system simultaneously from your area, simply repeat steps 1 through 3 above as many times as is necessary. MTS can set it up so that the multiple phone lines can be accessed with a single phone number. Try and get a "fancy" number from MTS, such as 472-0000 or 472-1234.

We would like to contribute to the costs of getting this started in Flin Flon. I don't know the numbers yet, but I expect that we could pickup the install charges and the monthly rentals for about 90 days.
