Overview of OLT Funding

The OLT currently has two funding programs:

1. Learning Technologies Initiative

The Learning Technologies Initiative (formerly known as the OLT Contribution Program) supports projects that contribute to the increased understanding and awareness of learning technologies - what they have to offer; how they can be adapted and applied in a variety of settings; and how adult learners with varying needs and capabilities can best take advantage of them.

Funding for the Learning Technologies Initiative may be obtained through a Call for Proposals process which usually takes place once a year during the Fall. There have been four "Calls" since 1996 and 104 projects have been funded up until the last Call of November 1998. Although the Guidelines for proposals may be modified with each new Call, the 1998 Guidelines will provide you with general information on eligibility for funding, contents of proposals, assessment process, etc.

2. Community Learning Networks Initiative

The Community Learning Networks Initiative was launched in late 1998 and supports time-limited pilot projects, in partnership with community organizations, that can offer multi-point access to a variety of learning resources within and across communities.

Proposals for funding under the Community Learning Networks Initiative will be received on an ongoing basis; however, activities must be completed by March 31, 2002. More information is available in the Guidelines for Application.
