

Another successful year has passed for the Flin Flon library which saw a number of changes. Perhaps the most significant change was the retirement of our long serving Library Administrator, Phyllis Stadnick in March. For many people in the community Phyllis was the "face" of the library and her dedication and welcoming disposition will be missed. We have been fortunate in hiring Cindy McLean as the new Administrator. Cindy brings a different background to the library which is enabling the Library to maintain its place as an innovative and welcoming hub in the community.

Changing demographics have not left the Library unaffected. During the year, hours of operation were modified to better reflect periods of maximum usage. It is a regret that we cannot provide extended hours of opening on all days but budgetary constraints require pragmatic considerations.

The Library continues to enjoy the financial support of the City of Flin Flon, the Town of Creighton and the Northern Village of Denare Beach, along with the provinces of Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Without the commitment of these agencies, the Library could not exist. It is therefore gratifying that in this time of shrinking populations and multiplying entertainment options, many people continue to use the Library and its services. This is a tribute to the Administrator and staff of the Library who continue to provide a dynamic space that is a far cry from the stereotypical picture of a room full of dusty, unread books on gloomy shelves!


Alongside teaching computer classes I have also been able to learn how to do many of the librarian jobs including working the front counter, filing, pocketing, and many other duties.



etween DVD rentals and Internetready computers, the original purpose of the Flin Flon Public Library can sometimes become lost in a sea of technological advances.

But that is never the case Tuesday mornings during the Teddy Bear Story Hour.

The primary goal is to foster a love of books and reading in children," says library administrator Cindy McLean.

McLean oversees the program, wearing a bright smile as she reads stories to tikes seated on the floor of the Kinsmen Room, in the basement of the library.

Open to kids aged three to five, the sessions also include a craft related to the morning's story.

poster to hang in the library window for Trout Festival.


The program, offered free of charge, is a high-light for McLean, still new to the top job at the library.




A story to tell

hey say everybody has a story to tell, but Albert Gordon Stevens has quite a few of them.

At 88, the longtime former Flin Flonner recently self-published his first book, No Feather Beds: A New Twist to an Old Tale.

"I'm very happy about it," Stevens told the Portage la Prairie Daily Graphic. "It's quite an experience writing my first book. We have been so busy this spring that I really didn't think of it. Now it's starting to sink in a little."

The book relays Stevens' experiences with the Royal Canadian Air Force, with whom he served during and after the Second World War, and his life in Manitoba, including Flin Flon.

After leaving the Force in 1946, the Darlingford, Man., native — who goes by "Bert" — settled in Flin Flon. Here he worked with Sutton Pederson, Bert's Record Bar and HBMS.

Stevens and wife Gwen retired out west to Vernon, B.C., in 1986, but they main-

tained the friendships they had made while in Flin Flon.

When Gwen passed away, he returned to Manitoba, this time Portage la Prairie, where he still resides.

For Stevens, sharing his many wartime stories was important.

"It needs to be told," he told the Daily Graphic. "A lot of people don't realize what goes on. I hope that people enjoy it. There should be a few laughs, and a few points that will make you stop and think."

Stevens will be at the Flin Flon Public Library this Friday, Sept. 30, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. He will present his story and sign copies of his book as part of the 2011 Culture Days celebrations.
