LIBRARIAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1975

I am pleased and honored to submit the 18th Annual Report of the Flin Flon Public Library.

It has been an eventful year, with many changes. Due to personal reasons, Mrs. Margaret Hanna, our former librarian resigned in the latter part of August. Best wishes and sincere thanks to Mrs. Hanna and Mrs. Pat Gilmore, our retiring board member, for their years of service.

I regret, due to circumstances, my report will deal only with the latter months of the year.

Five new members have been added to the staff to assist in a heavy backlog of work.

ADULT SERVICES

We are continuing to handle University of the North books for the community. This is a great opportunity for Northern residents to further their education, and we are pleased to contribute to the program.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

After a lapse of a year, Story Hour was re-introduced for pre-schoolers every Friday afternoon from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Aprogram of story-telling, simple art work, fingerplay and games, is conducted by staff members and student volunteers, with between twenty-five and thirty children attending.

CO-OPERATION WITH SCHOOLS

Hapnot High School's work placement program makes available to us, six students a year for training process of two wooks per student.

McIsaac Jr. High School added a Library mini-course to their curriculum, with two students working with us one afternoon a week.

Our own group of Grade X volunteer girls have worked faithfully with us.

All of these girls have been an enjoyable and valuable help to us.

Mrs. Carol Pyne, Hapnot High School Librarian, and Miss Linda Hanson, McIsaac Jr. High Librarian, have been helpful in notifying us of school projects requiring library reference books. They have also passed on information acquired at ashool librarian's workshops, which they felt would be of value to us. Our sincere appreciation goes to Mrs. Pyne and Miss Hanson.

Books and films are loaned to Pelican Lake School and Beaver Lake Kindergarten, on a steady basis.

We have had three classroom sessions, and a visit from the school children at Deschambeault Lake.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

- 1. Boxes of discarded and donated books were packed and sent to Snow lake, Sherridon, Beaver Lake, Metis Friendship Centre, Midwest Drilling camps, and Northern Light's Senior Citizens Manor.

- 3. A series of displays by local clubs and associations was planned and is now being put into practice.
