#### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT for 1998**

We regret that Marlene Gregory resigned from the board in 1998 and that Dave Law's appointment as The City of Flin Flon's representative on the board was completed at the end of 1998. However the board was pleased to accept the addition of Blaine Veitch as Marlene's replacement and of Angela Simpson as the new City of Flin Flon Library Board member.

The "Info-Pod", the Library's public access computer set-up, became fully functional in the summer of 1988. This system provides the public with the following capabilities:

- Simple and rapid searches for books using either authors' names and/or sets of topic keywords:
- Direct access to the Internet:
- E-mail:
- The ability to access various information on CD-Roms, such as The Encyclopaedia Britannica.
- Access to high quality printers and scanners.

As well, in the near future, the system will provide library users direct access to books in any library in the Flin Flon School Division.

Kathleen Delgatty (Friends of The Library) has done comprehensive research on the computer-related policies of many North American libraries. This research has provided a framework for developing a set of policies for the Flin Flin Public Library. A committee, headed by B. Trevor, has established and implemented approximately 75% of the required policies. This work will be completed in 1999.

The cataloguing of all the Library's books into the computer system was completed in 1998.

The public response to the new computer system has been very positive and there has been a marked increase in the patronage of the library. However, many people are unfamiliar with computers and need a minimal amount of training to show them how to do book searches and how to access the Internet. To date Kathleen Delgatty has been doing that training. In the future we will need to formalise the process.

I would like to express my appreciation to Gretta Redahl, all the other members of the staff and Kathleen Delgatty for their continued work to make the Flin Flon Library a leader in Manitoba.

The Library has seen many changes over the year but none so profound as technology. It is my prayer that there will be a balance between the traditional role of the library and the expanding role due to the technological changes.

The new mission statement of our Library states that we are a "community resource centre" - information is the foundation of the new economy and we recognize this fact. We also promote self-reliance in learning - we all must become more responsible in the learning dept. and learn in an innovative manner in this fast paced society.

The challenge we face in the area of the dramatically increasing costs of materials is one that we are trying to deal with - the financial help through donations helps us. 
